Despite all these challenges, God has allowed us to continue serving, preaching, encouraging our brothers and sisters during difficult times, and glorifying His name in every place where we serve. In previous reports, I have mentioned the locations where I am active. For those who may not know, I am currently involved in three locations, with a fourth one coming soon, collaborating in evangelism, discipleship, and the equipping

of leadership within those congregations. This month, in one of these locations, we had two baptisms in the town of San Juan de Lagunillas, which is located 30 minutes from Mérida, alongside Brother Antonio.

In the congregation of Los Proceres, we continue with discipleship and evangelistic meetings, reaching out to the area for new contacts. This month, in the congregation located in Los Proceres, we have had many brothers and sisters suffering from dengue and others undergoing surgeries. We ask for your prayers for their swift recovery. We have also been part of this situation; my daughter underwent emergency surgery for appendicitis, and I was ill with hemorrhagic dengue for three weeks. Thankfully, we are both doing well, and God provided us with the necessary means and resources for my daughter's surgery, especially considering how difficult it is to secure an operating room and medical supplies. As I mentioned, these challenges also allow us to be a source of relief to others in one way or another. In July, we received a donation from other congregations outside of Venezuela, which enabled us to serve 25 families with food supplies. We know that it is not much and not a monthly occurrence, but it is a relief for those who find it difficult to obtain food consistently.



We continue forward with love and humility, asking the Lord to use us more and more each day for His glory. In

Tabay, thanks be to God, two brothers who were weak in the faith have been restored. Brother Melvin Muñoz, who is serving in that place, has done an excellent job. The membership has remained stable between 25 and 30 people. This month, an evangelistic effort is planned to find more people to study the Word with.



In Los Proceres, we are doing the same, encouraging the brothers to grow in their faith. We are also planning an evangelistic campaign to reach more souls for Christ. The membership in Los Próceres has been consistent, with an average attendance of 40 to 45 people. Despite the challenges we face as a nation, such as the political and economic turmoil, we remain steadfast in our commitment to serve the Lord and spread the Gospel. We trust that God is in control and that He will continue to use us mightily for His purposes.

As we move forward, let us do so with unwavering faith, knowing that our labor in the Lord is not in vain. Let us continue to support one another, pray for one another, and work together to build God's kingdom here on earth. To Him be the glory forever and ever. Amen.
